

## MULLIGAN CONCEPT TEACHERS ASSOCIATION TEACHER ACCREDITATION INFORMATION

The Mulligan Concept Teacher's Association (MCTA) is a group of physical therapists (physiotherapists) who are accredited to teach the Mulligan Concept. Currently, there are 42 accredited teachers internationally. All MCTA teachers have post graduate credentials in manipulative/manual therapy up to a standard set by [IFOMT](#). MCTA teachers have obtained mentorship in the Mulligan Concept and have passed the credentialing examination process.

The goals of the MCTA are:

- To educate clinicians world wide in the Mulligan Concept.
- To develop and accredit future teachers of the Mulligan Concept
- To ensure teachers and teaching are of a high caliber.
- To promote research into Mulligan Concept techniques.

The process of becoming accredited as a teacher and member of the MCTA is as follows:

### **1. Teacher applicant qualifications:**

- The individual must have a minimum of 5 years of relevant clinical experience.
- Have IFOMT or equivalent post-graduate training in manual therapy.
- Be a Certified Mulligan Practitioner or equivalent.

### **2. Necessary Conditions:**

- A perceived need for additional teachers in that region must exist as determined by the regional MCTA members.
  - Letter of reference from a MCTA member in their region.
- Written application to the regional manager of the MCTA.
- Payment of a non-refundable application fee.
- Assist MCTA teachers through a minimum of 2 cycles of the entire curriculum.
  - Exceptions may be granted in some developing countries.
- Applicant must be in good standing in their professional association and meet the above criteria to be considered for acceptance for examination.

### **3. Applicant Examination scheduled and administered.**

### **4. Successful examination: confers membership into the MCTA with all rights and responsibilities.**

**Examination failure requires a minimum waiting period of 2 years to reapply.**
